

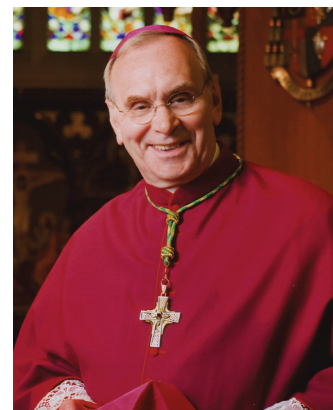
I am thankful for all of you who through your generosity make it possible for us to do this work, whether through prayer, volunteer activities or financial support.

This year at Catholic Charities we have continued to carry out our mission of service to our brothers and sisters in the Diocese of Covington, doing the Lord's work to alleviate the suffering of those in need. Our staff helped individuals and families in a wide variety of programs.


In this report you will read how we have fed the hungry at Parish Kitchen and provided a new home at St. Joseph Apartments for 16 homeless families. The mental health therapists care for those distressed in mind and spirit because of mental illness or the torment of addiction. In the parenting education program we have helped parents develop the skills they need to raise their children successfully. The housing counselors have intervened so that families have been able to avoid foreclosure and the trauma of losing their homes. Last year the jail ministry program taught men in jail how to rebuild their relationship with their children. Adoption program staff have helped find loving adopted homes for infants. Pregnancy counselors assisted women experiencing an untimely pregnancy with professional mental health counseling, as well as practical assistance with housing, transportation and medical care. Overall our programs have provided services to over 11,000 persons annually; and provided 75,000 meals each year at Parish Kitchen.

We take a holistic approach to serving our clients. As Catholics, we seek to be spiritually available to clients. Many clients seek out Catholic Charities because of this spiritual aspect. As a Catholic agency, we have the freedom to educate, explore and guide our clients on their faith journey. Sometimes they ask us to pray for or with them, and this is something we are able to do. It is part of how we respond to our Call to Discipleship.

We are very excited to unveil a redesigned website where you will find information about our programs and services. This redesign allows us to tell our story in a new and different way, using a new tag line, Extend a hand, Change a life. We have grouped our programs into four categories which are easy to understand and which show how our services are linked. The new groupings are Counseling Services, Child and Family Services, Housing Services and Community Outreach Services. You will be able to read more about the groupings in the pages of this report. I want to offer our most heartfelt thanks to our friends at Intrinzic, led by Wendy Vonderhaar and our Marketing Committee, who have spent countless hours working on this and on the marketing plan that accompanies it. We are profoundly grateful for their dedication to this project and their faith in our work.

In closing, I would like to thank Bishop Foys for his support and encouragement over the last nineteen months. I would like to thank all of you who have continued to support the agency during this time of transition with your time, treasure and talent, and most of all with your prayers. We are about to begin a new chapter in the story of the agency with the appointment of Alan Pickett as the ninth Executive Director of Catholic Charities. Alan brings a passion for serving the poor, and spreading the message of God's goodness among our brothers and sisters in need.

Our Service Lines

Counseling Services



Highlights

- 404 adults and 76 children received mental health or substance abuse treatment services. Through the addition of the following insurance companies—Anthem, Cigna, Humana and United Behavioral Health—the agency’s average fee for all counseling sessions has improved to \$22.00/hour in 2014 compared to \$15.00/hour in 2013.
- Our counseling program continues to adjust to industry standards of prevention and wellness and is one of five counseling agencies that supports a learning circle, Behavioral Healthy Quality Assurance with United Way. A new project this year is partnering with Gateway Nursing Students to offer a 6 week wellness program that provides education on physical and mental connections.

Counseling Services

At Catholic Charities, we provide treatment for all people who are seeking help to improve their mental health. Our Individual and Family Therapeutic Counseling Program has four Catholic, licensed counselors with advanced degrees.

Mental Health is a state of emotional and psychological well-being in which an individual is able to use his or her cognitive and emotional capabilities, function in society, and meet the ordinary demands of everyday life. In other words, good mental health helps us think and feel healthy, be successful and have loving relationships.

Mental illness is one barrier to good mental health. It can intervene and wreak havoc on people’s lives. Strained relationships, unemployment, and a general sense of instability can easily become barriers to success. Most people can say that mental illness has affected their lives, or the lives of someone they care about. Depression, anxiety, and ADHD are common diagnoses we hear about. Research continues to support that mental illnesses are very treatable and can have high rates of recovery, with the best treatment option being a combination of medication and counseling. The National Alliance on Mental Illness reports that 75% of mental illnesses are treatable.

Substance Abuse Treatment

Substance Abuse Treatment (SAT) is intended to help addicted individuals stop compulsive drug seeking and use. Behavioral therapies can help motivate people to participate in drug treatment, offer strategies for coping with drug cravings, teach ways to avoid drugs and prevent relapse, and help individuals deal with relapse if it occurs. Behavioral therapies can also help people improve communication, relationship, and parenting skills, as well as family dynamics. We have two certified SAT counselors, and the agency is licensed by the Commonwealth of Kentucky as an outpatient facility for substance abuse treatment.

At Catholic Charities, we are proud of our “generalist practice” approach. Catholic Charities accepts some insurance plans, and operates a sliding fee scale for those who do not have insurance. We provide adult, teen, parent-child, marriage and substance abuse counseling. Because we are a small program, we are able to take the time to really listen to people, to make an informed diagnosis, and together with the client make a plan for what the client needs to improve their overall health.

Our Service Lines

Child and Family Services



Highlights

- 53 pregnant women and 86 family members received counseling
- 8 infants were placed in loving adoptive homes
- 186 parents learned healthy ways to communicate with and discipline their children
- 576 children received mental health counseling at their school
- 381 juniors high students learned about poverty in Northern Kentucky
- 380 children took part in classroom activities promoting healthy self-esteem and problem solving skills

Pregnancy Counseling

Our work with families starts with pregnant women and their unborn children. We offer women who are experiencing an untimely pregnancy, their partners and families a safe and supportive environment where they can explore the options of parenting her baby or making an adoption plan. Through the generosity of our donors we are able to offer help with necessities such as rent or medication.

Adoption Services

In 1948, the Adoption Program began as the first program of the agency. There are many hundreds of families that have been impacted by our adoption services since our inception. Our state licensed program prepares pre-adoptive parents for the joys and challenges of parenthood, including the specific challenges of raising an adopted child.

Parenting Education

Our services to parents are concentrated on those who are struggling with raising their children because of mental illness, substance abuse or domestic violence. Through parenting classes and small group therapeutic work with parents and children, we help families develop stability and healthy support systems.

School-Based Counseling

The School-Based Counseling Program offers mental health counseling in a school setting. In schools throughout Northern Kentucky, predominantly Catholic but including several public schools, our counselors work with children who in many cases have no access to other mental health services.

Asset Building for Children

These programs are offered in Catholic grade schools and teach healthy self-esteem, conflict resolution and decision-making. Through curriculum targeted for specific age groups, children develop the confidence they need to express their feelings in a healthy way.

The Youth Insights Program

The Youth Insights Program is offered to schools and parishes preparing youth for Confirmation. Participants spend the day learning about poverty in Northern Kentucky through visiting local social service agencies. Afterwards, participants discuss how they can help people who are in need, and plan and carry out a group fundraising project that assists a local agency they have chosen.

Our Service Lines

Housing Services



Highlights

- 70 individuals became mortgage-ready after attending a homebuyer education class
- 155 households avoided foreclosure and retained their homes
- 25 adults and 26 children who were formerly homeless, living on the street or in a shelter now call our St. Joseph Apartments home

Housing Counseling

Catholic Charities provides three programs related to housing. We have offered pre-purchase education and counseling for first time home buyers since 1998. Using a curriculum approved by the US Department of Housing and Urban Development, our HUD-certified counselors teach the basics of home buying to people who may be the first in their families ever to buy a home. The program includes the basics of financial literacy to help participants assess their readiness to buy. The counselors work with those who are not yet ready to help them develop achievable goals so that they will be able to become homeowners in the future.

Our foreclosure prevention services have helped hundreds of families retain their home in the years following the recent financial crisis. Our counselors work one-on-one with those in danger of foreclosure and with the banks who hold the mortgage. The housing counselors are available to work one-on-one with individuals and couples who are struggling with managing their money and find they have too much debt. They will also work with community groups teaching the basics of money management.

St. Joseph Supportive Housing

Our St. Joseph Apartments are two eight-unit apartment buildings in Elsmere. Catholic Charities owns these buildings, which house sixteen families. With funding subsidized by the US Department of Housing and Urban Development, we provide this housing, along with intensive case management services, to previously homeless families and individuals. Families must include at least one adult or child with a disability. This is permanent housing and families may stay indefinitely, though most choose to move on when they have achieved stability in terms of employment and income. Tenants use case management services to achieve the degree of self-sufficiency of which they are capable. Rent is based on income, and the amount is determined by a sliding scale. Rents vary from \$0, for tenants who have no income to \$662 for a family of four where the head of household works and earns approximately \$27,000 per year. All utilities are included in the rent. The case manager also assists tenants in developing achievable goals. Typical goals include finding and keeping a job, learning how to budget and manage money, developing a healthy lifestyle, or gaining a GED or other educational qualifications.

Our Service Lines

Community Outreach



Highlights

- Volunteers had 1500 contacts with jail inmates
- Over 75,000 hot meals were served at Parish Kitchen
- 8 staff members participated in the “Catholics @ the Capitol Event” in Frankfort
- Case management services are now provided to the guests at Parish Kitchen

Parish Kitchen

Parish Kitchen provides lunch every day of the year to the hungry and homeless, and has been doing so for the last 40 years. Located on Pike Street in Covington, Parish Kitchen provides not only a healthy and nutritious meal, but also a warm and welcoming environment where everyone who enters is treated with respect. Some of our guests rely on Parish Kitchen as their main source of nutrition. Others count on Parish Kitchen for assistance at the end of the month when SNAP benefits are exhausted or the upcoming paycheck is not due for a few more days. This year we have started to offer our guests assistance from a case manager, who will help with referrals to other resources and with items such as obtaining their ID.

Jail Ministry

This program works with people who are incarcerated and the newly released, and offers support to family members and to victims of crime. The goal of the program is to help people who have been convicted of crimes avoid reoffending, and to help them develop the support they need in order to do so. The jail ministry program is also involved in advocacy work at the state and local level for prisoners and ex-offenders, their families and their victims.

Client Care and Referral

Our staff supports people who call the agency seeking assistance, as well as people who walk through our door asking for help. If we can provide the needed service, Client Care will facilitate the request. If we do not, we provide referrals to our extensive network of community partners and other providers.

Disaster Response

Catholic Charities’ Disaster Response is activated when there is a local disaster, the last time being the tornados of 2012. In 1990, the US Conference of Catholic Bishops commissioned Catholic Charities USA (CCUSA) to respond to disasters in the United States. We provide relief and recovery services and work with parishes and community partners to provide emergency food, shelter, direct financial assistance, counseling, and support.

Public Policy and Legislative Advocacy for Social Justice

Catholic Charities participates in “Catholics @ the Capitol” gatherings which take place in preparation for the legislative sessions of the Kentucky state legislature.

Focused on Stewardship

Catholic Charities, Diocese of Covington is blessed to have support of over 2,000 donors, grantors and volunteers who have generously participated in our mission to provide help for so many people in need. This report is a celebration of the amazing things that people of good will can accomplish when they gather their gifts of time, talent and treasure in the service of humankind.
